SAEMAUL UNDONG is one of the major factor in economic development and industrialization in Korea through community spirit of residents, residents' self-leadership, formation of environmental and resource friendly villages, and principle of sustainable development. Therefore, in this course, factors which make SAEMAUL UNDONG successful in Korea as well as further challenges are analysed in various case studies. Based on these case studies, global SAEMAUL UNDONG cases around the world are also discussed to find out problems and alternatives. At the end, sustainable global SAEMAUL UNDONG model is explored for alleviating global poverty and developing the third world countries.

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FOREST RESOURCES AND ECOLOGICAL RESTORATION	MAJOR	FOREST ECOLOGY	0012	SIN Joon-Whan	3	MON 13:00-16:00 TUE 9:00-12:00	PSPS 602	This course deals with 1) roles of woody species in the ecosystem, 2) various environmental factors which influence the forest, and 3) responding strategy of woody species to the environmental changes, on the basis of understanding of a forest ecosystem which encompasses 1) the distribution of plant species in the forest, 2) interrelationship between plant individuals and environmental factors, 3) competition between plant individuals, and 4) symbiotic relations. In the class, tree growth, competition between woody species, competition between woody species and other organisms, interrelationship between woody species and environment, adaptation mechanisms of trees to changes in environment, structure and functions of a forest ecosystem, the changes of a forest ecosystem in time and spaces, forest succession, and ecological forest managements are also studied.

Those resources include mainly non-timber forest products (NTFP). Among the NTFPs in Korea, fruits/nuts, saps, mushrooms, wild flowers and medicinal herbs are dealt in the class. Forest farmers in Korea dealing with those items described above and their productivities and incomes are introduced in the class. A field trip to farming areas of short income generation is scheduled for discussion.
