Visiting sites include industrial complex, R&D centers, physical infra such as dams and expressways, and institutions involved in development policies. Students are required to submit a report regarding the sites they have visited.
FOREST RESOURCES AND ECOLOGICAL RESTORATION MAJOR	1st & 3rd Semester students	MAJOR	산림경제학	0019	FOREST ECONOMICS	3	TUE 09:00 - 11:50	402	LEE YOCHAN	10	Compulsory	This lecture is taught to provide basic knowledge and theories on forest economics that concentrates on choices with respect to a particular limited resource, forests. This course supposes that students will study the tools of financial investment analysis. Students will apply the mathematics of investment analysis to evaluate alternative land management regimes. This course also provides information on how the wood products sector is structured. Student will study what factors affect consumer demand for wood-using goods, derived demand for wood as an input to the production of wood products, and supply of timber and wood products. In addition, this course deal with the role of forests in producing both market and nonmarket goods.
	1st & 3rd Semester students	MAJOR	사방및복원생태학	0018	EROSION CONTROL AND RESTORATION ECOLOGY	3	WED 09:00 - 11:50	602	LEE HAKHOON LEE DONKOO	10	Compulsory	This course is designed to provide the student with knowledge and fundamental skills necessary for integrating the principles of erosion control techniques and watershed management such as stream restoration, soil erosion and sediment control plans. These skills cover both theoretical and practical applications, including erosion assessment and modeling. The primary purpose of erosion control is to reduce the erosive effects of surface water runoff on exposed soil. Reducing the source of the surface water runoff can provide a significant improvement to erosion problems. The student will develop a general understanding of erosion control techniques including mulching, matting, covering with plastic sheeting, silt fences, settling ponds and protective berms. The followings are topics to be covered during the course: erosion plots using natural and artificial rains, mechanics of erosion by the water, rainfall study, modeling, empirical and physical based model, and application to different spatial and temporal scales. This course will also enable students to understand the delineation of watersheds and rainfall-runoff characteristics and design stream restoration and bioengineering projects using stream geomorphology and open channel flow techniques. This course is designed for giving an overview of the interdisciplinary topic of ecological restoration focusing ecological theories, ecosystem functions and structures.

The principal objective of wastewater treatment is generally to allow human and industrial effluents to be disposed of without danger to human health or unacceptable damage to the natural environment. Conventional wastewater treatment consists of a combination of physical, chemical, and biological processes and operations to remove solids, organic matter and, sometimes, nutrients from wastewater. General terms used to describe different degrees of treatment, in order of increasing treatment level, are preliminary, primary, secondary, and tertiary and/or advanced wastewater treatment. In some countries, disinfection to remove pathogens sometimes follows the last treatment step.
