This course also provides information on how the wood products sector is structured. Student will study what factors affect consumer demand for wood-using goods, derived demand for wood as an input to the production of wood products, and supply of timber and wood products. In addition, this course deal with the role of forests in producing both market and nonmarket goods.
