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| Core | ACTIVITY1 | SAMULNORI |
| Core | RESEARCH METHOD AND THESIS WRITING SKILL | This is to develop practical skills and theoretical understanding of research methods required to examine and analyse phenomena in community. For this purpose, quantitative methods as well as case study methods based on qualitative analysis are taught in order to analyze data and write research report. Students will be able to find out problems in community and analyse them with statistical skills after studying a wide range of research process including research design, conceptualization, data collection, data processing and analysis, and interpretation. Through these research methods and skills, changes of community are well understood and how to develop the community is explored. |
| Core | UNDERSTANDING OF PRESIDENT PARK CHUNG HEE LEADERSHIP | In Korea, which has the presidential system, management and leadership styles of the president play significant roles in direction and future of the nation, and personal characteristics such as leadership have decisive influence on the nation's management style. Therefore, roles of presidents and their importance in the nation's fortune and leadership as personal qualities is studied in this course. Particularly, the leadership of president Park Chung Hee, who contributed to the unprecedentedly rapid development of Korea, is studied, and nature and role of national leader are examined. The relationship between president Park and administrative organizations as well as his leadership style are analysed and the leadership in the policy making process is researched. At the end, role and leadership of the president to advance the country are shown by exploring how to utilize the leadership of president in national management. |
| Core | UNDERSTANDING OF KOREA ECONOMY | Development processes of Korean economy and the role of international trade and its policies are studied in order to advance the general understanding of Korean economy. In international context, various subjects such as globalization, economic divide among countries, foreign trading policy, and Free Trade Agreement, are investigated, and their influence on Korean economy and how to response to them are discussed. Other domestic issues, including development processes of Korean economy, relevant institutions, industrial structure, development strategy in different economic areas, and inter-regional economic structure and divide, are addressed. In addition, changes of international as well as domestic economic environment, and the current status of Korean economy are examined and further direction of development is explored. |
| Core | ECONOMICS ANALYSIS | This course deals with fundamental tools for economic analysis. The tools include both micro and macro economic models. The course teaches students the types and structure of markets, how each market operates, and the principle of resource allocation. Macroeconomic topics include determination of national income, growth theory. Some international issues are also covered. |
| Major | RURAL DEVELOPMENT | Rural areas need to develop differentiating strategy from urban and even other rural regions by developing and utilizing tangible as well as intangible resources and values in the rural area. This course includes inheritance and development of regional traditional cultural resources; development of rural experience programmes from natural resources; and revitalization of regional economy. Therefore, successful direction of rural development is presented based on case analysis of rural development in advanced countries of agricultural industry. In order to make sustainable development of rural community whilst securing originality, the role of leaders to lead the development is vital. In this reason, education system needs to be established to train leaders who are able to lead regional development and redesign rural community relevant to modern circumstance. |
| Major | INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECT MANAGEMENT 1 | Students in this course will learn how a project is reviewed, planned, implemented and finalized in the context of international development cooperation gaining familiarity with the techniques of a project management over the entire course of its process as well as result management to ensure achieving goals set for each step. The course also leads the students to have an understanding of how a management system can be rendered more effective and result-focused by way of incorporating the tasks of monitoring and evaluation into each step of the project. Also discussed are practical approaches and research methods that are directly applicable in the field of international development cooperation. |
| Major | DENDROLOGY | This course is taught to learn identification, distribution, taxonomic and ecological characteristics, and uses of angiosperm and gymnosperm tree species in Korea, including important exotic tree species. |
| Major | MACRO ECONOMIC POLICY | This course examines the roles of financial and fiscal policies in development strategy. Specifically, discussed are growth of markets through liberalization policies and issues regarding advancement of financial markets and reform of supervisory system. In addition, what kinds of fiscal instruments can be used to mobilize resources that are required to promote development. |
| Major | FIELD STUDY IN SAEMAUL UNDONG1 | This course provides students with an ample opportunity to take field trips to historic sites of SAEMAUL UNDONG movement. They are expected to observe the achievements of SAEMAUL UNDONG and other related data. The students will also have chances to talk with local residents who have participated in SAEMAUL UNDONG and have an interview with them. We will conduct pre- and post-field-trip sessions to prepare and feedback the results of the field trip in order to make the field study more effective. |

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| Major | FIELD STUDY IN INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION1 | This course aims to enhance the students' understanding of international development cooperation and improve practical field skills including English communication and leadership skills through an overseas field study opportunity. Students will also learn report writing techniques for their study plan essay and post-trip report. Evaluation of performance includes presentation of field study report. |
| Major | FIELD STUDY IN FOREST RESOURCES1 | This topic deals with a broad understanding of relevant knowledges on forestry and ecological restoration through visits to government institutions, universities, research institutes, and factories which are relevant to the forestry sciences, as well as to sites of afforestation and ecological restoration. |
| Major | FIELD STUDY IN ECONOMY DEVELOPMENT1 | This course offers students an opportunity to visit field sites of economic development. Visiting sites include industrial complex, R&D centers, physical infra such as dams and expressways, and institutions involved in development policies. Students are required to submit a report regarding the sites they have visited. |
